School Focus Areas for 2018

All schools are required to develop a Business Plan to outline their areas of focus and strategies they are using to improve outcomes for students. Our areas of focus for 2017- 2019 are:

Educational Excellence

Educational Excellence - with a focus on the implementation of whole school Numeracy, Literacy and ICT plans based on the analysis of student achievement data. Coaching support for teachers in Numeracy to support the development of Numeracy vocabulary and fluency in basic facts and problem solving.

Inclusive Learning Environment

Supporting Students at Educational Risk, Positive Behaviour in Schools Program implementation and ensuring our students with educational and special needs are catered for.

Effective Partnerships

Developing positive communication with families, ensuring we strengthen relationships with the local business community and support agencies such as Allied Health.

Numeracy is a focus in the school due to our 2017 NAPLAN results which highlighted that our students in Year 3 and 5 were not performing as expected. We have put in place whole school approaches to support Maths, to ensure that we are focusing on what our data says is important for our students to show progress in their Numeracy learning.

Our literacy results are on track, with 74% of our Year 3 students performing above the National Minimum Standard. Our Year 5 students improved in their results also. We have had a number of new students in and out of the school over the last 2 years. We have a transiency rate of 28.5%. When we analyse our data, we look at the stable cohort of students. A copy of the Business Plan and the Annual Report for 2017, will be made available to families in the next couple of weeks via the app, our website and through seesaw.

Wandina Primary School Dress Code

Wandina Primary School has a dress code. Acceptance of enrolment at the school, is on the understanding that the school's dress code will be adhered to. Classes on excursion must be in uniform, unless the consent of the Principal to vary this has been granted. Parents will receive a note home, if students are not wearing their uniform on a regular basis. Kindergarten students are also required to wear school uniform.

- Footwear:** Shoes, joggers or sandals are acceptable. Bare feet, thongs and crocs (or similar) are **not** acceptable.
- Jewellery:** Jewellery is discouraged. The school accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to jewellery. Jewellery should be unobtrusive and not represent a health or safety hazard. Facial piercing is discouraged. Jewellery should be restricted to watches, plain rings, sleepers, studs and short simple necklaces. (includes Medic Alert jewellery)
- Cosmetics:** Other than for medical reasons (eg. Ruby birthmark), the wearing of cosmetics is not acceptable.
- Special Groups:** Head-dress of the Muslim community is recognised as appropriate uniform. (White, Navy Blue or Teal preferred.)
- Excursions:** Full school uniform to be worn unless otherwise authorised by the Principal.
- Hair:** Long hair should be tied back.
- Hats:** Must be worn for ***all*** outdoor activities as part of our Sunsmart policy.
- Students not following the dress code may be denied the opportunity to represent their school at official school activities, which include choir, school excursions, sporting and social events.**
